July 2025 Public Works Report (with recommendations)

Infrastructure:

- Poplar Street reconstruction beginning July 21st.
- James Street East Road collapse to be repaired following Poplar.
- Sewer flushing ongoing.
- Pothole patching continues with larger patches to be done in August.

Main Street:

- Flowers are growing very well.
- Main Street/Highway 75 town access to be patched by MTI this summer (offset road at entrance).

Grants:

- Accessibility grant denied.
- Trails Manitoba approved a grant towards trail reconstruction, to begin in August.
- Tree grant, 71 trees have been planted this year.

Public Works Yard:

- Consistent issues with overloading & abuse of the garbage bins.
 - Recommending
 - Garbage bins be permanently removed.
 - 2 bins to remain at the north side of the PW shop for Main Street & Town garbage pickup.
 - This will save the Town a significant amount per year in wages, tipping fees, and rental costs.
 - Recommending the recycle bins remain.

Morris Curling Club

next big event will be the AGM, which is scheduled for September 13th. Just like last year, there will be a dinner, entertainment and a small silent auction to help raise funds for the club. Tickets for the AGM will be sold for \$25. There has also been an increased effort to boost the social media presence.

Morris Museum

- The Museum is moving forward with a new bench project. This involves a cement pad, bench and arbor, with a plaque that acknowledges past Museum board members and contributors. The bench has been purchased, and the pad and arbor construction will begin in July. The Museum will also be getting a new front door later this year. Financials are in good standing, as the Bingo fundraiser has been incredibly helpful. The next project will be improving signage for the Museum.

Morris Early Learning Centre

- We have received full occupancy for the Main Street building, and school age students are now in the space. The RTM currently has half of its rooms open, but we are able to open an additional two rooms in September, and another two rooms opening later in 2025. This is as good of a situation as we can hope for. The plan moving forward is to continue to have staff in ECE training and to recruit new ECE's to the Centre.
