 A meeting was held between Brian Wiebe, Brigitte Doerksen, Arien Peterson, Taylor Braun and Tim Lewis on August 13, 2025.

Main Street:

- South sign rest area is now complete.
- Castle pots and baskets are all full and doing well.
- PW is looking into the idea of getting planters for trees on Main Street that can be moved.

• Water Plant:

- The issue of the genset running too frequently has been resolved and was a Manitoba Hydro issue.

Current Projects:

• Morris Wellness Comm. Report:

- At the last meeting new election of officers took place. Reba Krahn was appointed new chairperson.
- The wellness centre has approximately 200 active members.
- The committee is currently compiling a new wish list for equipment and ways to improve the facility.
- Discussion on new software has been put on hold while the current supplier upgrades their service.

Morris Area Senior Services:

- Sloweness of Manitoba Housing to address the maintenance and renovation issues of the Davidson Centre resulted in a formal letter being sent to their property manager with C.C's to Lauren Stone and the Town of Morris, requesting timelines and a contact person. We have had a response from Lauren indicating that the centre has been identified for capitol improvements. The wait goes on.
- As numbers increase for pickup or delivery of meals, the need for a minimal charge of \$1.00 for containers is to be put in place for Sept 1, 2025. Meal cost is still \$7.00 with many complements on quality and quantity.
- Work is continuing on a new MASS website.
- New officers were elected with Dave Thiessen being named Chairperson.

Riverview Golf Course:

- Discussion centered around maintenance of the golf carts and getting waivers signed honoring the return of a functional unit (as per the one they took out). The decorating committee for the GLO-BALL tourney on August 30th is set to go. There are currently 41 individuals signed up.

Moris Curling Club:

The club is now preparing for the AGM, which is scheduled for September 13th. Financially the club is in decent shape, but a good portion of that was a result of the grant we received from the province. A successful DEKALB Superspiel is also necessary for the club to maintain its good financials. We are also preparing for the start of the leagues, with signup happening at the AGM. The club has also been selected to host the Junior Provincials this February. Planning is well underway.

• Morris Museum:

The summer season is winding down, and we only have a few weeks left with our summer student. The Museum crossed one project off the list, with the 40th anniversary bench and pergola

being installed. The next project is improving the signage for the Museum and replacing the front door.

Morris Early Learning Centre:

- We are opening up more rooms in September. This means that the ratio we have between trained ECE's and CCA's meet the requirements, as long as we are able to hire another CCA. We are prepping for the AGM and are waiting on the audited financials from GTP. We have one board member leaving after the AGM, but our current number of board members are still well within our guidelines. Financially, the centre needs to continue to have staff trained so we can open the RTM at full capacity. Once all of our rooms are opened, we can lower the deficit on the submitted budget. Main Street has been fully open for a few months now, and we have applied to have more funded spots for school aged children, but there is no timeline as to when we can receive approval for that.
